Housing market offers quality for dollar

A return to simpler ways may dictate a trend that speaks louder in words than in the pocketbook. New is not necessarily better, appears an analysis of the market. With this in mind, prospective home buyers are on the look-out for throwbacks to simpler and more peaceful times. Old world elegance has definitely become chic, even in the form of fixer-

uppers.

The market consists generally of first time home-buyers, according to local realter Jacques E. Asselin. "Their needs are a bit more modest," he feels, that is inevitably reflected in the price range.

"Houses are more affordable right now," he states, and that people who are in the market for a new home are definitely getting value for their dollar. Since the recession hit, prices have fallen and as the province looks to the end of the recession real estate is between 25 and 30 percent lower

than average.

For people with money to invest in real estate, it is a good time he feels. "It is definitely a buyer's market."

For those who are looking to renovate areas of the home for higher resale value, Asselin offered a few hints.

The spectrum of colours available in home decor are endless, and pastel walls are very popular, especially in the kitchen and bathroom. Clients also look for co-ordinated countertops and cabinets.

Jacques has noticed that younger home-buyers seem to prefer a more colonial look when it comes to doors and trim, while the more experienced home-buyer targets a natural wood finish.

"Hardwood flooring is becoming quite popular again. It is a nice feature."

The rustic elegance of wood is timeless. Although it may be a larger one-time capital investment as compared to other flooring covers, it is tough and resists wear. Numerous stains and finishes are available to compliment any decorating style. Nothing can emit country warmth like wood.

Consumers are also looking for cleaner and more efficient means of heating their homes, feels the realtor. In a move toward conserving fuel and resources, homebuyers prefer natural gas. This is also true of fire places. "People are going away from wood," as far as fire places go.

It is an alternative heat source that works very effectively during the winter months, and afterward there isn't a yellow residue to

clean (as opposed to wood).

If homeowners are looking to renovate, Jacques suggests they start in either the kitchen or the bathroom. These are key areas that will increase the value of a home for resale. Buyers look for cleanliness and new brilliance in these two particular areas of the home pertaining to hygiene.

Not only is the inside of the home important, but according to Jacques, the appeal on the outside of the home makes a distinct first impression. "Curb appeal," refers to the tidiness and attractiveness Please turn to page 3

Plan ahead for home safety

Home is a place to relax and generating even further savings. unwind. With the storms of life howling across the fields outside, it is a place of warmth and safety. Or is it?

Every year we hear and read of homes that have been destroyed; ravaged by fire, prized possessions are lost forever and, worse yet, lives come to an early and horrific end. And while misfortune touches all of our lives in one way

or another at times, the real tragedy in house fires is that so many of them could have been

prevented so easily.

There is a tremendous technology available to the modern family, a technology that would make the average house fire almost impossible to get started, and which can defeat it quickly and easily if it does ignite. The problem with it is that it is not affordable for most families. Be that as it may, there are still a lot of things, inexpensive things, affordable things, that you can do to make your house safer and your family better protected.

> If you're heating with wood, check out your pipe work annually. You should also have them cleaned out by a trained technician on a regular basis. The idea here is to avoid build-ups of creosote on the inner linings of the pipes, a tar-like substance that can (and will) catch fire. This build-up is the leading cause of most chimney fires and chimney

> fires can quickly spread.
>
> The same sort of idea applies to using your fire place. The first fire of the season should be proceeded. by a quick check to make sure that no birds have built nests in the chimney or to ensure that there are no other obstructions. Check for creosote too.

At my house, I have installed a metal grate over the chimney so that birds and small animals can't get it, so that's one worry less when I lite the fire. Another safety idea I employ is to roll up a newspaper, set it alight, and hold it at the base of the chimney. This makes sure that there is an updraught and no obstruction before you light the main fire.

But safety is not enough. You have to be prepared in case the unthinkable happens and you come face to face with a fire which is out of control.

Fire extinguishers are an inexpensive way to fight little fires before they become big ones. They come with operating instructions and maintenance guides. Follow these and you won't go far wrong. Remember though, household fire extinguishers are not meant to fight big flames: if you'-

re in that situation, get out of the house.

Fires often start when people are asleep. All too often, but the time they wake up, if they do, it is too late to escape the smoke and flames. You can get a huge head start by installing smoke detectors. They are inexpensive and very effective when they are maintained properly and batteries are replaced at regular intervals.

The other thing you need to do, especially if you have children in the house, is to conduct fire drills. Everyone from the youngest child should know what to do in the case of fire: who do they tell? how do they get out of the house? what alternative ways are there to get out of the house, other than the stairs? where does everyone meet once they are outside?. All of these issues (and others, no doubt) need to be clarified before a fire starts in order to eliminate panic and ensure an effective escape. Such drills don't cost a penny but are priceless in terms of safety and peace of mind.

Some people have big homes, some have small homes and some have middle sized ones. No matter. A home is a home. Our home is our home; a place where we can relax and take it easy. With a little effort, it can be not only comfortable but safe as well. Take a look at your house. What can you do to make it a safer place to

Pellet stoves: environmentally-friendly choice

It is a simple yet enterprising idea. Use the by-product created in the production of lumber and turn it into energy.

This is the idea behind wood pellet stoves, a new form of household heating that has made an appearance on the market in the past few years.

Pellet stoves are cleaner and more efficient than their cousins, wood stoves. They make heating

with wood easier than ever before.

The fuel source recycles wood waste while burning extremely clean. Sawdust, a mixture of soft and hard woods, is dehydrated to form little pellets that are transformed into energy.

While there are numerous models on the market, they all revolve around the same principle.

Each pellet stove has a hopper that stores between 40 and 55 pounds of pellets.



Although it is recommended to take advantage of the slower summer months to call in a technician from your fuel company's service department, many homes are using their heating systems already and an annual furnace check-up is strongly urged.

In addition to providing a thorough inspection of the furnace, filter, burner, water heater and other home heating and cooling accessories, technicians will spend time with customers discussing the available options to upgrade or change the heating system for maximum efficiency and energy savings.

"It is wise to spend time each year examining your family's heating, cooling and domestic hot water needs," suggests John Butt,

executive director of the Canadian Oil Heat Association. "As equipment gets older and a family grows, energy needs change and a heating technician will help make sure the homeowner is getting the best value."

For example, many homeowners with an older oil system simply need a new fuel oil burner to save a considerable amount of money and energy--as much as percent, according to Butt.

"A new burner can be installed for a reasonable cost on an existing appliance if the heat exchanger will withstand the higher flame temperatures.'



Homeowners opt for safer interest rates in market

Nearly 60 per cent of homeowners with NHA insured mortgages selected a five-year mortgage term in mid 1995, according to the latest edition of Mortgage Market Trends released earlier in September by Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMH-

"This compares with the one third of clients who picked the longer, five-year term during the second half of 1994 and the beginning of this year," said Marc Pellerin, CMHC senior economist. "The shift confirms that homeowners with NHA insured mortgages give high priority to predictable and stable costs in a volatile

environment for interest rates." The findings in mortgage term selection and preferences by homeowners in the 1990s include provincial differences.

This issue of Mortgage Market Trends also reports that the value of home mortgages outstanding rose to \$336.1 billion during the April-June period, up only 0.6 per cent from the previous quarter, the smallest percentage increase since the end of 1982.

under way and the expected increase in new construction, lending is poised for a recovery and could show full-year growth of three to five per cent, following a slow first half," Pellerin added.

Two other special feature articles review the factors responsible for home mortgage insurance claims and the experience of the RRSP Home Buyers' Plan. Both discuss national and provincial trends.

Heat efficiently with a heat pump

Even with homeowners setting area, wells stay at an average 10 C their sights on alternatives to electricity, heat pumps are still considered one of the most efficient ways of keeping a house warm in the

Electrical heating may not waste any energy for heat production, but heat pumps do a better job of keeping ahome from turning into a freezer when the mercury dips below zero.

The system turns a home into a refrigerator.

In sub-zero weather, the machinery still manages to draw heat from the great outdoors. In the summer, it takes heat from the house and pumps it outside.

With a 10 degree Celcius temperature outside, a heat pump is 350-400 per cent more efficient than an electrical heating unit. The freon in the heating-cooling system doesn't turn back into a liquid until the temperature dips to minus-40 C.

Heat pumps are divided into two types—air source and water source. The water source variety are even more efficient than units that pull heat from the air. In the immediate year round.

"A lot of people are still scared of heat pumps," said Gary Proulx of Manotick Energy. "When they first came out, a lot of them were trashy. The air source were always breaking down. It has changed now. The bad ones are off the market now."

While Ontario Hydro is trying to keep customers from turning to oil and natural gas for their heating needs, the utility does want to reduce its January peak loads. Heat pumps still keep customers wired to its generating plants.

Up-front costs for getting a system installed depends on the size of the unit purchased and the amount of work it takes to get it up and running. A homeowner can pay anywhere from \$5,000-\$14,000, depending on the job.

With the amount of money saved in heating costs, it should pay for itself in about three years.

In the summer, air conditioning costs are also cheaper with a heat pump system.



Rate slide boosts housing affordability

affordable this year due to falling mortgage rates, according to the Canadian Housing Markets report, released earlier in September by the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC).

During the first six months of 1995, an average of 30 per cent of those renting were in a position to buy their first home. This is up from 27.7 per cent in the last half of 1994.

"Mortgage rate relief is continu-ing to bring down monthly payments and by July, 36 per cent of renters could afford a starter home," said Dan Guerrette, senior market analyst with CMHC's Market Analysis Centre. "Slow price movement, ample supply and stable mortgage rates will keep homes affordable for the rest of 1995.

affordable average starter home price in Canada at \$67,000. Just over half of Chicoutimi renters can afford to buy a home. By contrast, Vancouver has the most expensive average starter homes at \$188,000 and just 20 per cent of renters in that city can make the move into home ownership.

"Falling rates, flat house prices, and the construction of more modest homes have given the first-time buyer a wide selection of starter homes to choose from in most centres," said Geurrette.

Half the new homes sold in the first six months of 1995 went for prices first-time buyers could afford. In addition, nearly half of the homes on the resale market in June were affordable to first-time home shoppers.

Loan approvals under CMHC's

first home loan insurance (FHLI) program have increased since the first quarter of 1995 in response to a two per cent drop in mortgage rates between March and July. This is seen as a key indicator of first-time buying volumes.

This edition of Canadian Housing Markets also has a profile of first-time buyers who bought with the help of the FHLI program. The data helps builders and realtors learn who first-time buyers are, what they are buying and how they are financing their first

FHLI's introduction in 1992 improved down-payment affordability. In fact, 45 per cent of FHLI buyers would have delayed buying three or more years had they needed a conventional mortgage which requires a 25 per cent

The findings also show that during 1992-95, more and more buyers had household incomes under \$50,000. This means that ownership markets have been

opening up to larger segments of the population due to improved affordability. During the same time, more single person households and older Canadians were buying homes for the first time.


