RUSSELL—Toes were tapping and fingers were snapping as the 14th Annual Ottawa Valley Olde Tyme Music Jamboree played Sat., June 12, to a very appreciative audience in the Dr. Kinnaird Arena in Russell.

Event chairman Gerry Polite and his organizing committee co-ordinated to put together 11 1/2 hours of traditional Ottawa Valley old time fiddlin' and dancin' entertainment.

The afternoon show and dance featured the Rideau and District Olde Tyme Fiddle Club, the Moonlighters Band, the Renfrew County Old Tyme Fiddlers and a group called Olde Country - very obviously real crowd pleasers - from Brookfield, N.Y.

So popular, in fact, was this group that they were back to get the evening show under way.

More than 30 camping units of all shapes and sizes were on the grounds for the weekend and small jam sessions around the trailers were common occurrences.

According to treasurer Shirley Alexander, "Afternoon attendance was up over last year but, overall, paid admissions were down from last year. 784 people attended this year's event as compared to 869 last year, a difference of 85."

Much speculation abounded as to the reason for the lower attendance figures and Alexander speculated that the beautiful weather kept many away. The first really nice weekend of the summer saw farmers in hay fields and gardeners and homeowners busy with various chores of their own.

Despite the lower attendance, organizers say there is a good possibility that, in the final analysis, there may be as much revenue as in past years.

This year's recipient of the benefits of the jamboree is the Children's Aid Foundation.

Kay Stanley, representing the Foundation, accepted a donation from Mike Quinn, president of the East Osgoode and District Olde Tyme Music and Dancing Association, the group hosting this year's event.

She told the crowd, "We, at the Children's Aid Foundation, are honored and excited to be singled out to benefit from your generosity. These funds will certainly be put to good use at the Foundation."

## Cardinal playwright parodies Ken Carter theme

MANOTICK — A political parody with ties to the Seaway Valley is entertaining audiences at the Manotick Fringe Festival.

The action takes place in the Eastern Ontario community of Variety.

Never heard of the place? That's because Cardinal's J. David Black only recently created it for his play, *The Last Canadian Daredevil*.

The production, directed by his brother Darren Black, opened in Kingston June 10 and ran until June 12. It re-opened at the Fringe Festival in Manotick June 13 and will run until June 19.

The political parody is based on an actual incident that took place in Morrisburg in the late 1970s when

daredevil Ken Carter, the self-styled "Mad Canadian", built a ramp to attempt a jump of the St. Lawrence River in a jet-engine equipped Lincoln Continental.

After having a car and ramp built to many of the actual specs indicated in the play, selling tickets and appearing in Eastern Ontario parades and public events over several years promoting the jump, he disappeared.

The mythical name, Variety, is not a Canadian version of Thornton Wilder's *Our Town*, but a town set spicily in that landlocked Bermuda Triangle with its cardinal points at Kingston, Ottawa and Cornwall, called Eastern Ontario, says David Black.

### EASTERN ONTARIO

Eastern Ontario is often taken as an awkward assembly of Orange Lodge

activists, Ottawa Valley rustics and English-language rights zealots, says the author.

Though it is all of these things, this half-forgotten outback is also the ever loyal, English Canadian heartland, where a significant part of the national identity quietly resides, he adds.

"The play treats all of these contradictions with loving and bitter irony."

Although the Ken Carter story inspired the jump theme, the Ken Canada character is meant in no way to resemble Carter as a personality, nor does the larger narrative here derive from Carter's own spectacular life, adds Mr. Black.

Having the Carter story at core, the present play has been fictionalized significantly, rendering it a political parable with characters equal parts down

home realism and comic parody.

The sheer thickness of social life in a small town lends itself readily to multi-layered lives, narrative complexity and allegory, says Mr. Black.

There is little privacy allowed and this customary lack of social space should extend to the audience. Stage directions at several points call for the actors to refer directly to those assembled to watch the play.

The latter collectively take the role of townspeople at the parade and jumpsite, as well as spectators at a chautauqua.

The formal cast, however, consists of three characters whose roles remain consistent throughout the play, and three actors who play multiple speaking and mute roles.

Reeve Jim Fulsom is a late middle-aged man and a municipal Machiavelli; a thin conservative, he

favors black and is capable of the most dastardly deeds in the name of an often principled world view.

### CRUSADING JOURNALIST

The editor of the *Variety Vanguard*, Madeline McCorrie or Maddie, as Ken christens her, is a liberal crusading journalist and a strong middle-aged woman whose only weakness is weak men.

Last is Ken Canada, an overweight middle-aged carnival daredevil dressed in a maple-spangled cape and costume, and a man more dangerous to himself off the job than on.

A vaudeville look is the set for the stage with cardboard cards announcing the theme of each new scene affixed to a stand at each change.

The play runs until June 19 at the Manotick Fringe Festival.

# Heavy horses draft McNeely full-time

KEMPTVILLE — For local horse-pulling enthusiast David McNeely, his hobby has turned into a big job.

In his third year as president of the Eastern Draft Horse Pulling Association, McNeely, 25, spends much of his time either working for the association or with heavy horses.

Besides organizing Canada's Super Horse Pull — the biggest show of its kind in the country — McNeely is a pulling horse trainer. He spends about four to six hours a day training and caring for his

family's Belgians which compete in numerous pulling competitions each year.

Although McNeely was educated in the field of fibre optics, he says he now enjoys spending his time at the track behind the family farmhouse on the Boundary Road between Dundas and Grenville counties, training the horses.

While some hobbyists actually work their horses doing sleighrides; collecting maple sap, logging or in the field, McNeely's horses work out on the track pulling a stone boat. Following their workout the horses are washed down.

Diet is also important to keep the horses in top pulling condition. These friendly giants pack away six to eight gallons of horse ration, a bale of high quality alfalfa hay and added vitamin and mineral supplements each day.

They are fitted with special spiked shoes which are changed every four to six weeks.

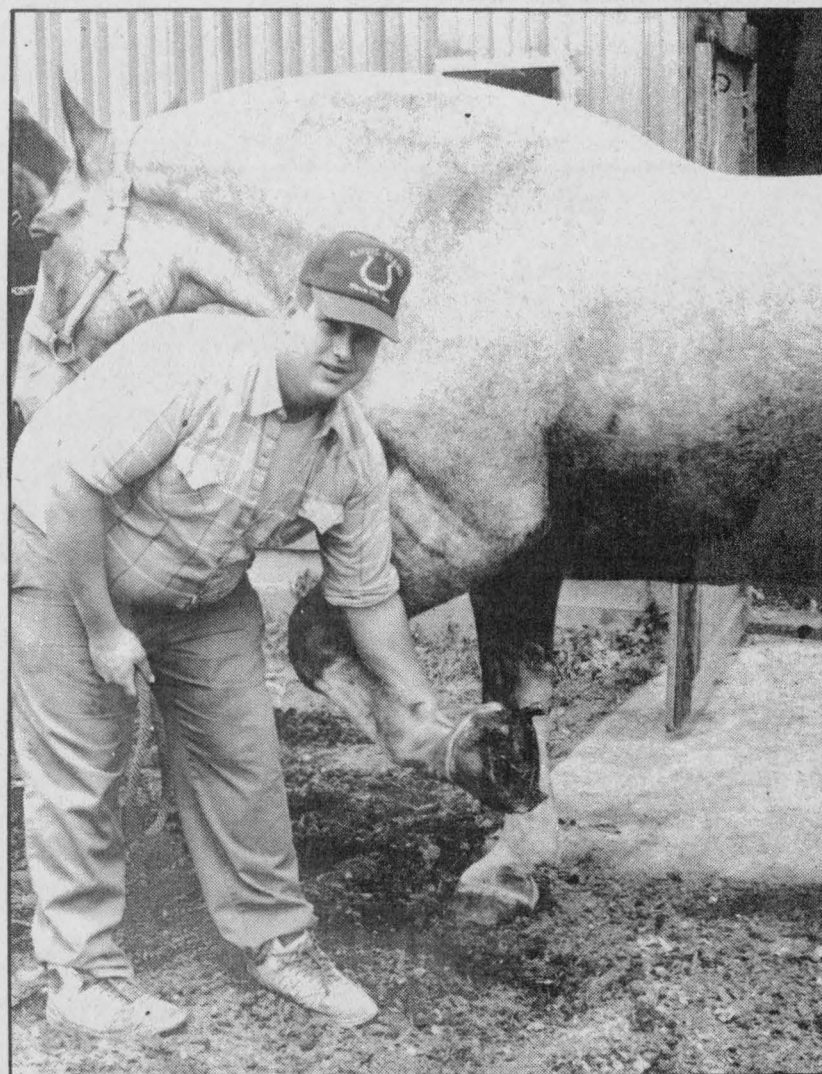
### THE PULL

The pull held Sunday at the A.M. Barr Arena in Kemptville, featured a light class with a combined team weight of less than 3,300 pounds and an open or heavy class.

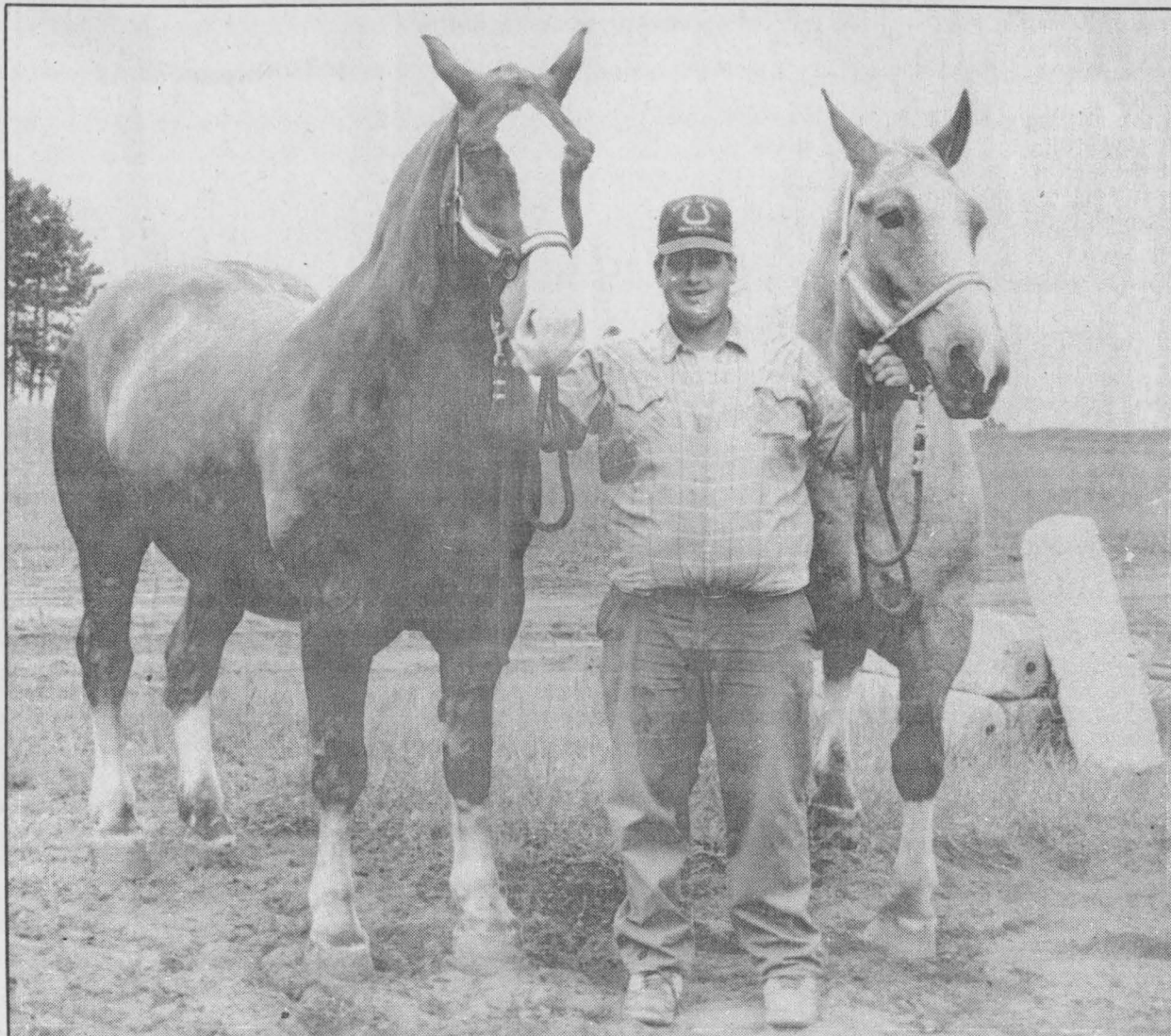
The competition drew entries from across Ontario, Quebec and approximately seven States.

Most pullers in Sunday's competition are members of the association, but not all.

According to McNeely, about 80 per cent of the pulling horses seen at local competitions are Belgians, but there are some Percherons and Shires as well.

## Pre-loan planning

A farm business does not experience financial difficulty overnight.

Many events take place leading up to the tragic happening. Usually the manager of the business is not aware of these happenings because of his daily involvement with the general production activities of the business.

Major capital investment such as buying land or erecting improvements does not take place every day. When these events occur, and borrowed money is involved, very careful planning should take place.

In situations when correct estimates are not obtained for improvements, and a short-fall occurs in the amount of money borrowed, the manager will usually draw upon his operating loan. Couple this mistake with the fact that the borrowed money is amortized over too short a period, a cash flow shortfall will occur before the business produces and markets additional units of output.

Add these factors to the reality that farm income will fluctuate dramatically within a given period of time, it becomes inevitable that a cash shortfall can occur at some point of time.

To avoid this happening, the farm manager should obtain correct estimates for the new improvements.

Make sure the components such as wiring and ventilation are included. Obtain three estimates; examine the estimates and select the most accurate one.

When meeting with the lending institution, make sure to borrow sufficient money to cover the total expenditure. Estimates can vary from five to ten percent below actual costs.

When establishing an amortization period try to lean toward a longer period of time than a shorter period. One guide is to match the amortization period to the economic life of the capital improvement. Usually, buildings have an economic life of 20 years.

When obtaining a mortgage, remember that you are charged legal fees, appraisal fees and sometimes, survey fees. When you have to refinance that mortgage at a later date because of a cash flow shortfall, legal fees and appraisal fees will be charged again as well as a substantial penalty.

The revenue side of the equation often gets neglected too, when a major building project is under way. Were those extra heifers or gilts bred to produce on time? Were extra plants ordered for greenhouses? Has extra quota been obtained?

Pre-loan planning will pay dividends in the long run. Give consideration to more aspects than the amount of interest you have to pay.

## Local farm groups make fair tax submissions

OTTAWA — Representatives of the Dundas, Stormont and Glengarry Federations of Agriculture were in Ottawa recently making a presentation to the Ontario Fair Tax Commission hearings.

Gordon Garlough of Williamsburg, Bud Atkins of Moose Creek and Richard Lapointe of Martintown made the presentation at the hearings on behalf of their county federations, June 1-2.

A series of about 20 public hearings were held across Ontario from April to June to hear submissions on the findings of eight working groups who studied tax issues.

In their submission, the three local federations made the following comments:

### RETAIL SALES TAX

Although the working group's report suggests that RST exemptions, except for food should be ended, the SD&G submission says that farmers, as food producers, should have an exemption for food production inputs or a rebate system

similar to that which is now in place for the GST.

"The commission and its working group has so far not recognized that matter," said Dundas Federation of Agriculture representative Gordon Garlough.

### WEALTH TAX

In regards to a wealth tax, farmers are opposed to having their assets taxed.

"Capital assets in the agri-food industry do not indicate the ability of a farm family to pay additional taxes. Thus productive agricultural assets should be exempt from any wealth tax," says Garlough.

### ENVIRONMENTAL TAXATION

The environmental working group report views agricultural inputs such as pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers, and fuels as environmentally damaging—therefore, suggest these inputs be singled out for a special environmental tax to generate income and discourage their use.

However, in its brief, the federation questions the working group's assumption that agriculture is "environmentally evil" and strongly objects to any environmental tax on farm inputs.

"The Environmental and Taxation Working Group report is alarming in its lack of knowledge and understanding of agriculture (and its) ignorance of the significance of agriculture to the Ontario economy..."

The SD&G brief further pointed out that pesticides and fertilizers are used both carefully and sparingly and that their use is declining both on a per acre basis and in total "on farm" use.

For example, the brief mentions that fertilizer (on average) is applied at 200 pounds per acre, while in contrast, road salt is applied at 5,000-8,000 pounds per acre. In Ontario, the total road salt use per year is 1.6 million tonnes, while agricultural fertilizer use amounts to 800,000 tonnes.

### PROPERTY TAX

According to the SD&G federations, the Property Tax Working Group, dismissed farm property tax as simply an agricultural issue and not a tax issue to be considered.

However, the SD&G brief suggests that the farm tax rebate is a tax issue and asks that it be recognized as one.

It also requests that the rebate be kept in place until such time as a satisfactory revision of property tax policy for farm property is enacted.

"Farmers want fair tax treatment compared to non-farm rural residents," Garlough said.

The Fair Tax Commission will submit its final report to the government by the end of this year based on the working group reports, the hearings, and briefs presented as well as written submissions received.

Other Eastern Ontario counties making up the agricultural rounding included: Prescott, Russell and Renfrew.

## Government extends cash flow program

OTTAWA — The Cash Flow Enhancement Program (CFEP), has been extended to the 1993-94 crop year, federal agriculture minister Charles Mayer announced today.

CFEP will provide low-interest cash advances on crops farmers have produced but not yet sold. For the 1993-94 crop year, the federal government and farmers will share interest costs on cash advances up to \$60,000. In previous years, CFEP provided interest-free cash advances of up to \$50,000.

Increasing the cap from \$50,000 to \$60,000 will help Prairie farmers and corn growers with high carry-over from last year's crop. Horticultural and row crop producers who traditionally take out larger advances will also benefit from the increased cap.

The announcement, in advance of the 1993-94 crop year, will help producers plan the cash flow requirements for the upcoming harvest. The program will cost the government an estimated \$32 million.

The producer interest rate for the duration of the 1993-94 crop year will be set by July 15, by the minister of agriculture, in consultation with the minister of finance. The interest rate charged to producers will not exceed four per cent.

# Senior citizens living older and better

June is Senior Citizen's Month and the Eastern Ontario Health Unit's theme this year is "Active Living Then and Now: Sharing Our Experiences". This is the first of a series of articles from the health unit featuring various topics of interest for senior citizens.

From watching television and reading magazines, an alien would be led to believe there is no point in being older than 35 in our society. Fashion, movies and music are all shaped by and for young audiences. Yet, by walking on any street, our alien would get a different message: this world is composed of different age groups.

The percentage of senior citizens

in society is higher now (11 per cent) than it was one or two hundred years ago, and by dawn of next century, their current numbers will have doubled. The fact is we live longer and healthier lives.

According to Statistics Canada, from 1966 to 1990, average life expectancy rose 5.1 years for men to 73.9 years, and 5.4 years for women to 80.6 years.

Nowadays, growing old does not mean being sick, having trouble with housing or not being able to move around very much. About 12 per cent of seniors become so frail that they need long-term care in institutions. And contrary to popular belief the older are not the less active.

Better brace yourself: in the near

future, many among us will have to change our perception of what it is to be old. In our daily life we will meet more and more active seniors involved in rent control decisions, lobbying for better housing and stressing their agenda in the political arena.

Many of them are in better shape and health than several 30 and 40 years olds! You can see them running laps in the gym, walking in malls, bicycling in the neighborhood if not playing tennis on the courts.

Just like the rest of us, senior citizens are catching the active lifestyle message, which means individuals who were expected to quietly retire in their golden years

will be the most alert and challenging of any comparably aged group in history - fit and vital, far and away from the stereotype.

Active people, and active seniors too, are also known to be more alert. This in turn means the average senior citizen will have more to share of his or her life experience, which will benefit the whole society. In Africa, when a senior dies, it is said that it is like a library burning away, a loss of knowledge and experience that can't be replaced.

During the month of June, the Eastern Ontario Health Unit will be organizing all kinds of activities for senior citizens. For more information, call your local health unit office.

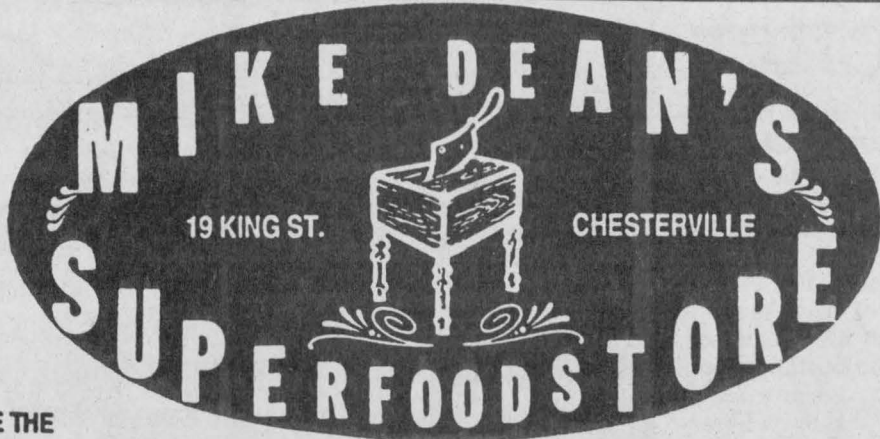
